“Give PrEP a Shot” HPTN 083 <i>Dr. Christopher Hurt</i>	<p>The HIV Prevention Trials Network (HPTN) is a global network funded by the National Institutes of Health (NIH). The purpose of the HPTN is to test safety and efficacy of interventions to prevent HIV. HPTN wants to provide a broad menu of options for HIV prevention that works with the individual’s lifestyle, similar to how different options are available for contraception. UNC collaborates primarily with Malawi, Vietnam and across the state.</p> <p>Pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) is an antiretroviral medication before an exposure to reduce the risk of becoming infected with HIV. Tenofovir DF is the most studied PrEP drug. FDA approved Truvada in 2012 which is the brand name for tenofovir. When taken consistently, oral tenofovir reduces risk of HIV infection by 90-100% among cisgender men and transgender women who have sex with men, plus</p>

	<p>heterosexual men and women. The drug is 84% effective for those who use injectable drugs.</p> <p>Cabotegravir is similar to existing medication. It's been formulated in an oral and intramuscular formats. Injections are optimally every 8 weeks. It's being evaluated for treatment and prevention of HIV.</p> <p>HPTN 083 study is called Give PrEP a shot. It compares the effectiveness of injections and oral tables as pre-exposure prophylaxis. It's a randomized, placebo-controlled trial. The study is for cisgender men and transgender women who have sex with men aged 18+. HIV-uninfected and at meaningful risk. UNC site began enrollment in January 2017. Sixty participants are needed and 28 are currently enrolled.</p> <p>Both study groups (control and experimental) of the study are getting Truvada or the test drug. Everyone is getting a drug to protect against HIV. Ideally people would stay in the study the entire time. Participants needs to be available every eight weeks for injections.</p> <p>The other purposes of the study are to normalize PrEP as a prevention option especially in marginalized groups, normalize research as an option for underrepresented, key populations and build trust regarding research.</p> <p>Transportation support is built into the study such as bus passes and mileage reimbursement. \$50 is given to participants per visit.
