<b>John Killeen: An Overview of an Amazing Tool – the Neighborhood Compass</b>	<p>Durham Neighborhood Compass is a tool to find aggregated data such as census statistics, sidewalks, crime, housing, etc. for census blocks within the county. In the future, the City would like to incorporate data from neighboring counties such as Wake, Orange and Chatham. The City is working on adding information to the education and health sections of the site. John walked the committee through how to use the website and what type of data is available. Most data on the site is updated annually.</p> <p>The City is working on a second version of the site which will allow the addition of data for upcoming years, an animated feature to see how trends change year by year on a map and a difference in how data titles are listed. The website can be used to help make decisions with program planning, policies and zoning. The second version of the site will be ready around February 2017.</p> <p>The City has been working with Duke, Durham County Department of Public Health and Lincoln Community Health Center leadership to add population health data to the site. De-identified health data will be available by neighborhood in the future. It was suggested to add a link to the Network of Care website to the Neighborhood Compass to identify local resources.</p>
