Guest Speaker Denver Bailey, MPH Epidemiologist Durham County Dept. of Public Health	<p>Opioid overdose information tends to be underreported due to coding changes in the ICD-10 coding system within the Duke Health electronic health record system. Issues with data are being worked out. The data is pulled from the NC DETECT data system. Denver will bring data from neighboring counties to the next meeting to compare to Durham County data.</p> <p>Denver has spoken to staff at Duke Health about including Emergency Department triage notes in the data.</p> <p>There was a sharp increase in the number of naloxone reversals via Durham EMS spiked in 2015 to 364 from 56 in 2014.</p> <p>Denver shared an infographic on substance use among high school students. The statistics on substance use in the past 30 days differs from SAMHSA survey data.</p>	<p>The committee should write a letter of support to Duke Health Emergency Department to include triage notes as part of the data when compiling data for opioid overdoses.</p> <p>Get data from the NC Harm Reduction Coalition and Skip Kirkwood with Durham County EMS.</p> <p>Get information from high school teen clinics and DCoDPH on drug use from intake forms.</p>	<p>Denver will give a short update on opioid overdoses at each meeting.</p> <p>Marissa will send Denver's slides to Cindy and Wanda.</p> <p>Denver will check SAMHSA data to compare to Durham County YRBS data.</p> <p>Denver will bring information on the numbers of people addicted to opiates in the community and within the prison system by ethnicity to the next meeting.</p>

The workgroup will begin finding out the needs of the churches previously contacted and move forward. Next steps are to get in touch with Kimberly Monroe at Duke University and contact five churches.</p> <p>Naloxone- Continue efforts to increase awareness and education around Naloxone use. Develop a document about naloxone including medication dropbox information to prevent unintentional overdoses. Reach out to NC Injury Prevention Task Force to partner on their naloxone and overdose campaign. Partner with NCCU and Durham TRY on the Lock It! Drop It! Campaign. Get the word out about www.naloxone.org. Cindy and Wanda have developed materials they will share with NCCU.</p> <p>Suicide Prevention- The workgroup has distributed a survey to Alliance and Duke providers. Eight-six providers responded to the survey. Next steps are to finalize resource information to send out to providers by the first week of November and reply to providers before Thanksgiving. The workgroup is planning to develop a listserv for providers interested in mental health and LGBTQ needs. The workgroup will focus on how to grow the listserv as a winter project. They are thinking about planning a training in the spring in partnership with Alliance Behavioral Healthcare on how to provide competent mental health to the LGBTQ community. Analyze the data to see what types of trainings providers need. The purpose is to remove barriers for youth gaining access to services.</p> <p>Resources- Alliance Behavioral Healthcare has a provider directory as of September 2016.
