This is a list of primary care and specialty medical services and programs that are available in Durham. It does not include all medical

services or programs in Durham but is intended to highlight the programs that provide medical care to those who have little or no insurance coverage. Some of



these programs also serve people with health insurance. However, we are highlighting the assistance available to Durham residents who struggle to pay for the medical care they need.

Public Assistance & Navigation programs

Medicaid

Assistance with paying for medical services for low-income individuals and families, foster children, elderly, and the disabled who meet the income/resource limits. Helps pay for doctor and hospital bills, prescriptions, and other qualifying health expenses.

Health Check (Medicaid) and NC Health Choice

Free or low-cost health insurance for children under the age of 19 (21 in some cases) with family incomes of 100-200% of the federal poverty level. Benefits include: well-child checkups, medicines, sick visits, dental care, immunizations, and other qualifying health expenses.

"Be Smart"

Medicaid program that pays for free family planning services to women 19-55 and men 19-60 years old whose income is at or below the 185% federal poverty level. Services include exams, birth control, testing, and voluntary sterilization.

Medical services

Lincoln Community Health Center

Health care including adult, pediatric and adolescent medicine; also provides dental, mental and prenatal health care. Pharmacy services also available. Fees are on a sliding scale based on family size, household income, and insurance coverage; families earning less than the federal poverty level pay only a small fee, and discounts are available for families up to 200% of the poverty level. The primary care doctors at Lincoln can refer eligible patients to **Project Access of Durham** to receive donated specialty medical care.

Based on the information provided, Durham Center Access will give a referral to a provider in the community. Assessment is provided free of charge; treatment with referred providers can be on a sliding scale.

Duke University Medical Center and Durham Regional Hospital

Charity care may be available to patients receiving emergent or urgent services whose income is 300% or less of the federal poverty guidelines. Generally applies to care received in the emergency department or within an inpatient setting. Requires application and approval by the Health System. Patients may also receive assistance in applying for Medicaid or other funding programs which will cover some or all of the cost of care.
