## Mapping Health Collaboration

### 2017 FINDINGS SUMMARY

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## WHAT IS THE MAPPING HEALTH COLLABORATION PROJECT?

In the summer/fall of 2012, Dr. Branda Nowell and her research team at North Carolina State University set out to create the first comprehensive map of collaborative partnerships in Durham County and understand their connections to each other via shared members. Five years later in the spring/summer of 2017, we revisited Durham County to see how the community of collaborative partnerships had changed. Why? We know that communities are dynamic and the network of collaboration is likely to evolve over time. By understanding the structure of this network and its evolution, we can gain better insight into community systems for improving health and wellness. This can aid partnerships to think and communicate about their work as it is positioned within this broader network of activity.

### FINDINGS:

#### WHAT DOES HEALTH COLLABORATION IN DURHAM COUNTY LOOK LIKE?

- Our research identified 30 active partnerships focused on improving health and wellness in Durham County in 2017, seven of which are new since 2012. A summary of the 30 partnerships that were involved in our project is provided in Appendix A
- Across the 30 participating partnerships, 354 different organizations/divisions<sup>1</sup> and 792 individuals were represented as active members
- Of these, 105 organizations and 114 individuals were represented on *multiple* partnerships

#### STUDY METHOD:

A “partnership” for this study represents a group of three or more organizations or agencies who meet regularly to improve health and wellness in Durham County. Using a snowball sampling strategy, we identified 34 different health-oriented partnerships in 2012. In 2017, we interviewed leaders from all partnerships identified in 2012 as well as 7 partnerships that had formed. Member lists from each partnership were collected and analyzed in both 2012 and 2017. Using social network analysis techniques, we were able to document connections across partnerships represented by shared members. 100% of partnerships identified in 2017 in Durham County elected to participate.

#### HOW HAS THE DURHAM COUNTY NETWORK OF HEALTH COLLABORATION CHANGED SINCE 2012?

The community of health-related partnerships in Durham County has remained robust from 2012 to 2017, even though there was a reduction in the overall number of community partnerships from 34 to 30. There was some turnover in the number of partnerships, with 7 new partnerships becoming active in Durham County since 2012. Key changes in Durham County’s network between 2012 and 2017 included:

- Several new partnerships emerged. New partnerships formed to take advantage of new philanthropic or government funding opportunities, as well as grew out community needs assessments or recognition that a past initiatives are now more able to organize as a community partnership.
- Eleven partnerships adjourned or transitioned into a different form (e.g., became a program, organization or merged with another partnership) since 2012 due to overlaps with another initiative that shared similar membership or changes in leadership, overall membership engagement, or funding.
- The total number of organizations engaged in community partnerships decreased by approximately 20% in 2017. There was also significant ‘churn’ in the organizations engaged in the work. **About 1/2** of the organizations currently active in Durham County are new to the network since 2012.
- Similarly, the total number of individuals involved in partnerships appeared to decrease from 2012 to 2017 by 13%, and there was significant turnover. **Close to 2/3** of the individuals currently active in Durham county partnerships are new to the network since 2012.

In order to increase the readability of the network maps, *only those organizations with representatives belonging to two or more partnerships are included*. However, a complete list of all organizations involved in health-oriented partnerships in Forsyth County is provided on pg. 16.

- 1) Blue squares represent partnerships that were present from 2012-2017
- 2) Red circles represent organizations that were present from 2012-2017
- 3) Aqua squares represent partnerships that are new since 2012
- 4) Yellow circles represent organizations that are new to health partnerships since 2012
- 5) Lines represent membership of an organization to a partnership
- 6) The full names of organizations are posted in Appendix B

What does it mean if...

- *My partnership is in the center of the map?* The more central the partnership – the higher proportion of its members that it shares with other partnerships in the community
- *My partnership is on the periphery of the map?* The more peripheral the partnership – the lower *proportion* of its members it shares with all other partnerships in the community
- *My partnership is close to another partnership?* Generally, the closer two partnerships are located to one another on the map, the more members they share in common. See Map 2 for more information.
- *My organization is central on the map?* Organizations in the center of the map are represented by members attending more partnerships





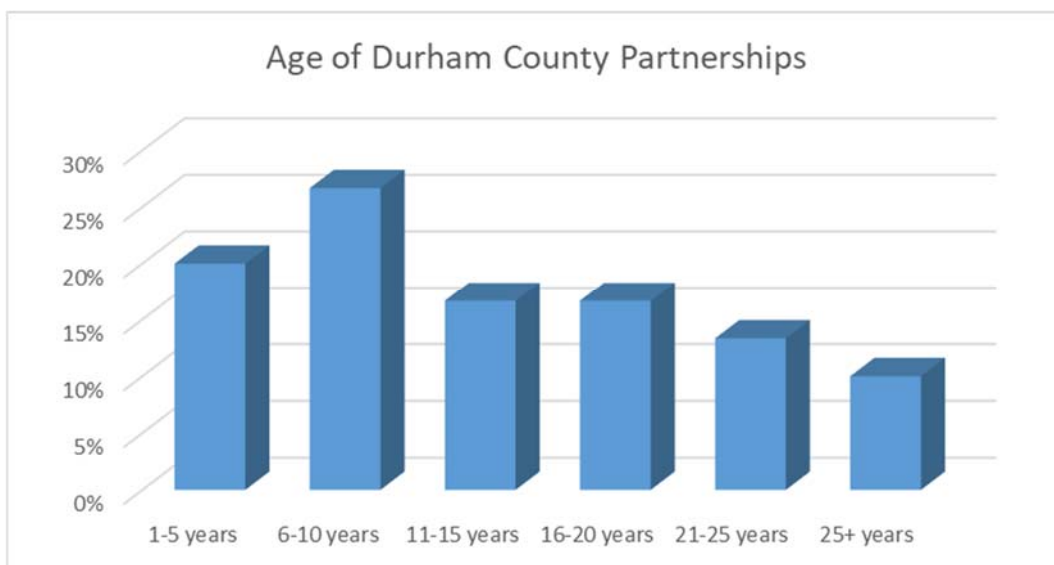

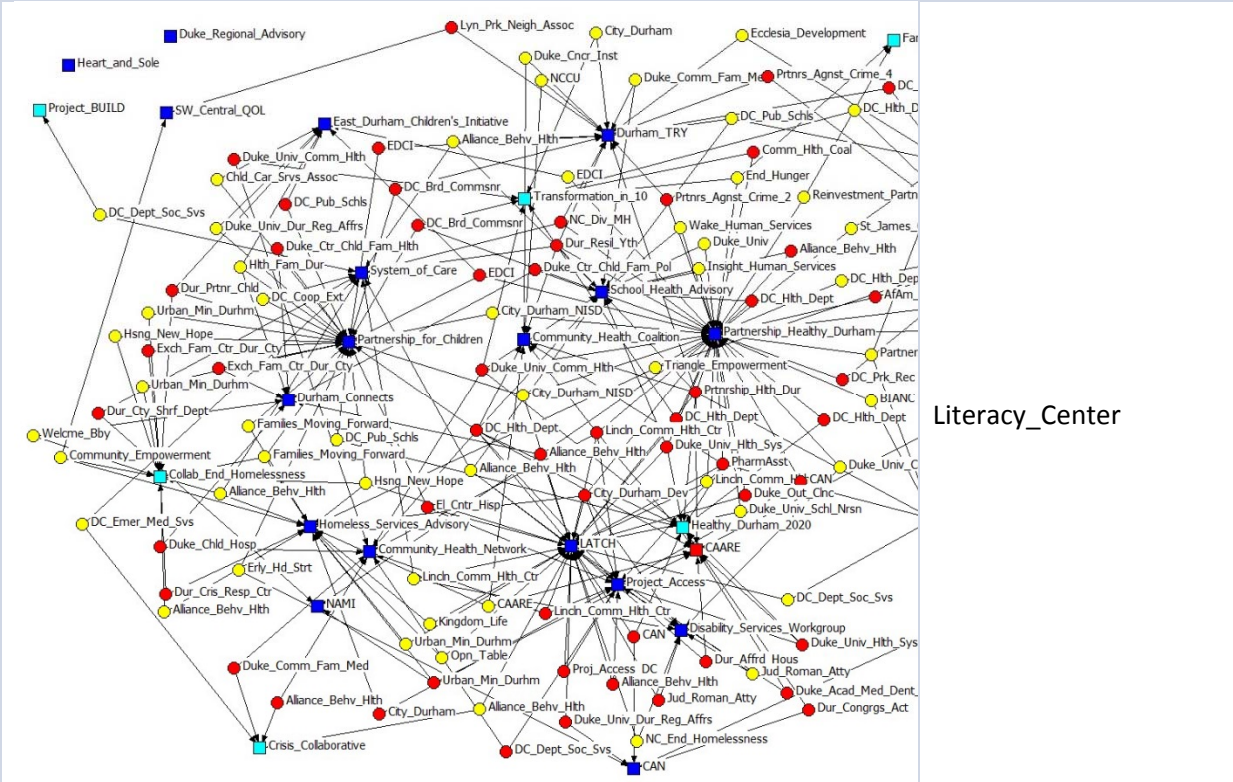
