<b>Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) process, tools, &amp; resources</b> <i>Bria, Brian, and Don</i>	<p>Don Bradley reviewed the CHIPs process by starting with the mission, vision, and racial equity principles of the Partnership. Next, the Community Health Assessment/CHIP process. The group then reviewed the five recommendations offered in the 2020 CHA- Durham Affordable Housing Loan Fund, Durham Housing Bond, Public funds are available but pathways for the City and County funds are complex and burdensome, increased awareness of free and fair city inspections, and there are substandard HA and non-DHA affordable housing properties in Durham with concentrations on low-income and disabled folks. This plan must also follow the Healthy NC 2030 plan. Durham has one of the most severe housing problems in the state.</p> <p>Bria defined goals, objectives, and strategies. Following, the group looked at the website. Afterwards, Don showed the timeline for the process and indicated that they may need to meet outside of traditional meeting. Possibly having workgroups to focus on specific goals and report back to the entire committee.</p> <p>As we develop goals, consider how we can add to the initiatives already started. This can be about bringing information to decision makers about healthy housing in addition to physical housing units.</p>	Charlene Reiss will email the logic model developed by the Health and Housing Committee in 2020.
