Review Durham Health and Housing Infographic <i>Savannah Carrico, Durham County Department of Public Health Epidemiologist</i>	<p>Savannah Carrico developed a Durham County Health and Housing infographic.</p> <p>About 60% of Durham County resident own homes and there are obvious racial disparities. Housing prices are rising. The average one-bedroom apartment has risen by about 40%. The median home price has increased to \$370,000. Someone would need to work 140 hours per week if making minimum wage. Minimum wage has not increased since 2019. However, all Durham City and County employees are paid a minimum of \$15 per hour.</p> <p>Page two includes listening session data reflecting positive and negative feedback about housing in Durham.</p> <p>Feedback included:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Adding context around disparity with Hispanic or Latin population

The policy excluded people of color which had a racist impact.• Landlords have been stricter on qualifications for renters. Information on this concern would be helpful.• Participants gave positive feedback on the infographic overall. <p>Savannah will make the recommended changes and re-present the infographic to the entire Health and Housing committee.</p>
