Improvement Plans (CHIPs) Discussion	<ul> <li>Trifold and handout, multiple ways to get out information, complexity of the information may need workshops, some meetings with support at churches, community events</li> <li>Aging Well Durham - make documents accessible for individuals with disabilities (able to be read by assistive devices), provide at bus stops, food insecurity is still an issue (include flyer with food packages as they are given out)</li> <li>Clinics has new patients come through online resources (tough to keep updated)</li> <li>The navigators are under Legal Aid of NC. In Durham, most are located out of Lincoln. Durham County Library is using QR codes and sharing information via their Digital Navigators.</li> <li>Needs to be updated regularly and help connect with the people with those resources - case managers, mental health, ED, pastoral care and others (Carol Swanson, Angel &amp; Kimberly Monroe) Make sure to include in the packet - primary care, mental health, flu vaccination and all the resources available at the same time.</li> <li>Partnered with local radio stations (Radio One and Le Ley) for community announcements .Would love to do that again and include other resources. You may consider running stuff past the Mayor's Committee for Persons with Disabilities. They can vet for accessibility and also disseminate info. The Mayor's Committee may be open to receive presentations and support outreach events. The Human Relations Commission is also dipping their toe into health equity. They plan to do a health fair in July or August. Collaborate with the Communications Committee. Glad Angel is here as a member of the committee.
