9:00 – 9:10	<p>Welcome, introductions and approve October meeting minutes. What is your favorite Halloween candy?</p> <p>The meeting minutes were approved.</p>		
9:10 – 9:35	<p>Update from the Health and Housing Committee. Charlene Reiss is a Partnership Health and Housing Committee Co-Chair. The Health and Housing committee is the newest in the Partnership. Affordable Housing is the top health issue identified in the 2017 Community Health Assessment (CHA) and was carried over through the 2020 CHA. They are working to learn what their role is without duplicating existing affordable housing efforts. The committee focuses on the health aspects of housing. They have had, and will continue having, conversations with the City of Durham about housing codes and what is considered safe. One of the things the committee has been looking at is providing data for decision makers on what makes housing healthy. Last month, Libby McClure came from Data Works and shared the data they have on housing. It involves looking at the needs of home buyers and renters. They want to get information about resources to renters so that they are aware of resources.</p> <p>The committee has been inviting community partners who already work in housing so they can learn about current efforts. After that, the focus will be on how they can support efforts. There are many barriers to data sharing. The committee is working to identify the information available and share that information in ways that are understandable and useful.</p>		<p>Bernadette Greene wants to be added to the Health and Housing committee. She has been impacted and wants to help.</p> <p>It would be helpful for the Communications committee to develop a set of communication tools, like a communications resource center. Information and branding from the Partnership that is consistent across the board would also be helpful.</p>

The next step is translating the learning into doing. The committee isn't sure of what they need with communication right now. Going forward, they will be communicating with the community and with stakeholders specifically on housing issues. Does the Communications committee already have templates of presentations for the Board or County Commissioners, or of educational materials?

The Health and Housing committee meets the third Tuesday of each month 8:30am-9:30am. All are welcome to join. Their focus is on those who are most vulnerable in the community.

Question: Is there affordable housing in Durham? Where is it?

Answer: This committee hasn't focused specifically on affordable housing because there are other groups working on this. If we were working on that, we should focus on those who are below that line of affordability, especially for those who are unemployed and unhoused or are housed in unsafe conditions.

When folks with section eight housing are looking for housing and there isn't any, they are being told to go outside of Durham. This impacts people's mental health in addition to physical health. The Health and Housing committee plans to work more with the Mental Health committee to address the intersections of housing and mental health.

The affordable housing in Durham is poorly maintained. At an affordable housing site recently visited, every door had a different light fixture. Every tenant installed their own. There were also safety concerns with the metal stairs. Another set of apartments are going to be built in the Braggtown area and in Northeast Durham. It is important to remember that the City does not build housing. Developers partner and build it.

The Communications committee has built a list of Durham Information Communicators and can distribute information that way. When there is something major, we can also involve the Communications Specialist from Durham County Department of Public Health.

Question: have you worked with UNC Health and Duke Health research cores? They may be able to track COPD or asthma.

Answer: The Health and Housing committee has not. A lot of the work is done based on who committee members know. Blake will ask if there is a centralized location for all of that information and share at the next Health and Housing committee meeting. Additionally, Blake will connect folks to Charlene via email.
