Events	 Valon is here as a community member. She has helped to navigate accessing care. She would like to host an event in May during mental health awareness month and teach people how to navigate and advocate for care. There is an empowerment piece for community members. Content can include which questions you should ask and sharing some general navigation tools. She initially reached out to local schools. Valon wants to focus on empowerment and equipping people with the knowledge and information they need. She would like to primarily focus on mental health for one piece and potentially offer a series. The mental health focus brought on the idea. We could package a program format for schools, congregations, etc.
