Women's Health Clinic:

Healthcare service for women who might want to have a baby. It includes different things that happen before and after the baby is born. Women can get help with family planning. They can learn about different ways to prevent pregnancy, if they don't want to have a baby right now.

Breast & Cervical Cancer Control: (919) 560-7600 The program helps women who cannot afford to pay for breast and cervical cancer screenings and follow- up services.

Free HIV & STD Testing and Counseling: (919) 560-7601

Free, fast, and private testing for HIV, syphilis, chlamydia, and gonorrhea. They keep your information confidential, which means no one else is told about your test results without your permission.

Early Intervention Clinic: (919) 560-7726

If you or someone you know has HIV/AIDS, you can get medical and social work services help. This means that doctors and other healthcare workers can help you take care of your health, and social workers can help you with things like housing, employment, and other needs. It doesn't matter what stage of HIV/AIDS you're in; the clinic can help. The fees for services are based on Lincoln CHC rates, so they're affordable.

Helps keep you healthy by giving you vaccines. Vaccines are like medicine that can protect you from getting sick. Children are required to get certain vaccines, and adults can also get some vaccines for a fee.

Help you follow up on things like doctor's visits, vaccines, and other important health check-ups for your children. They want to make sure your child is growing and developing properly.

Offers free loans of medical equipment to people who live in Durham County. This equipment includes things like wheelchairs, walkers, shower chairs, and canes. You can use these items if you need them because of an injury or illness.

Helps people stay healthy by providing different types of medical care for adults, children, and families, as well as dental and mental health options.

They also offer services like lab tests, x-rays, and low-cost medicine. Lincoln works with most types of health insurance and will charge less money based on how much someone makes. If someone doesn't have insurance and doesn't earn much, they can still get help for a small fee. People with lower incomes can get even bigger discounts.

Transportation and interpreter services are available.

The clinic offers primary care, which includes things like check-ups and help with illnesses. They can also test your eyesight, check for HIV, and connect you with other programs that can help you get the care you need. The clinic asks for a \$20 donation, but you don't have to pay if you can't afford it (income below 300% FPL).

The BEC helps people who have Medicare and don't have a lot of money. Medicaid program for FREE birth control, STI testing/ treatment, helps prevent unplanned pregnancies, and offers other reproductive health services. To qualify, a person's income has to be at or below a certain level, which is 195% of the federal poverty level. There are no age restrictions for this program and it is for both men and women.
