
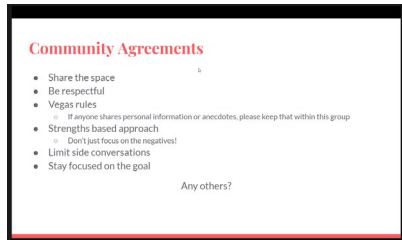


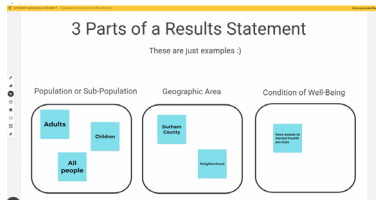

We still had more work to do on these so we are starting there today. Krista asked participants to use the Jamboard to document their answers.</p> <p>Marissa introduced the CHIPs process. They will be covering the results statement and population indicators today.</p> 	<p>non-crisis support: The statewide Peer Warmline is a phone line staffed by Peer Support Specialists who offer non-clinical support and resources to those in crisis. Peer Support Specialists (or "peers") are people living in recovery with mental illness and/or substance use disorder who provide support to others who can benefit from their lived experience. Their unique expertise helps reduce stigma while strengthening overall</p>	<p>Marissa will ask the data team at DCoDPH to look at the data to see which zip codes are available.</p> <p>A work group will need to meet between now and the next meeting to solidify the results statement.</p>



The results statement encompasses the following:



The group used Jamboard to add the components of the results statement.

Population: All people + Historically excluded

- One person suggested focusing on folks who have the worst mental health outcomes like African American you people, LGBTQ young people, or parents.
- Another person would like to wait to specify the population. They wouldn't want anyone to feel left out of the statement although we may want to look at these specific populations.
