Edeia- Roundtable going well. Last meeting 18-22 attendees. Latisha Arnold-Johnson from Durham Tech spoke about continuing work after the course/certification. There are also discussions of free/affordable trainings, planning, brainstorming topics and networking options, and after the current cohort (8) almost 120 CHWs will have been trained. Edeia will send a flyer to be shared with the listserv and requests resources for free/affordable training.
Sally- The CHW Workgroup continues to meet setting goals for the year, discussing increasing paid opportunities. Strategic planning for the year is being finalized.
Nancy- Medicaid expansion, increase in applicants, 2000+ in December, the expansion has allowed for people, who were not previously able, to qualify. Doing outreach to Durham Rescue Mission and LCHC. Updating website to share where to go and apply. E-pass encouraged, but single adults may not be familiar and can come onsite for help. DSS had a job fair in Oct 2023, adding 22 workers to help with the eligibility/application process. Elizabeth and Shelisa thanks Nancy for the efforts.
Uma, a student, introduced herself and requested interesting stories from organizations. Angel suggested that organizations contact her. Edeia shared a story about a CHW who was hesitant to get vaccinated but was able to two years later and to be more informed when speaking with the community after attending a program on misinformation.
